Thunderbird In past issues of our newsletter we have written of the mythology surrounding thunderbirds. To continue we will add, "just a little more 'myth' to the mighty Thunderbird."



In Algonquian mythology, the thunderbird controls the upper world while the underworld is controlled by the underwater panther or Great Horned Serpent. The thunderbird throws lightning at the underwater creatures and creates thunder by flapping its wings. Thunderbirds in this tradition are commonly depicted as having an X-shaped appearance. This varies between a simple X to recognizable birds. The X-shaped thunderbird is often used to depict the thunderbird with its wings alongside




its body and the head facing forwards instead of profile. All the depictions on this page are of "Thunderbirds".

Spotlight on Norm Wisner Coach, Athletic Director, Principal, and Superintendent From 1961 to 1994 A Student/Athlete's Perspective of the "Early Years"



To say that the name "Norm Wisner" is synonymous with Tumwater High School and the Tumwater School District is an understatement! He was part of the first group of staff members at the newly opened high school in 1961. Over his 31 year career at the Tumwater School district, Norm held the positions of Teacher, Assistant Coach, Athletic Director, Assistant Principal, Principal, Assistant Superintendent, and Superintendent. He was involved in the hiring and mentoring of many legendary coaches and teachers at THS. He budgeted, funded, and oversaw the construction of most of the district's current facilities, including half of the current school buildings, the football stadium, gymnasiums, and related locker and weight rooms. Norm was also instrumental in the development, construction, and implementation of the New Market Vocational Skills Center, which serves several local districts. His commitment to the community and specifically Tumwater High School athletics over such a long period have earned Norm Wisner a place in the THS Athletic Hall of Fame. This opening paragraph was taken from the 2016 THS Athletic Hall of Fame Induction Ceremony.

Clearly Norm Wisner left a legacy of excellence in teaching students, coaching athletes, administering programs, and leading organizations and people!

Former student/athletes recall Norm Wisner in the early days of THS. To begin with, Norm was mentored by THS's first Principal, Dr Joseph L. Kearney who went on to become Athletic Director at the University of Washington, Michigan State University, and Arizona State University. He retired as Commissioner of the Western Athletic Conference in 1994. Dr Kearney was a dynamic leader/motivator/administrator who set high standards and was driven by achieving positive results. He certainly had great influence on the staff he assembled and mentored at THS from 1961 to 1963. Truly a "rising star" among this staff was young Norm Wisner, Earth Science teacher, Assistant Basketball and Assistant Football Coach on Dr. Kearney's staff.

What stood out about Norm Wisner was his unique ability to "connect" with students and athletes. In the classroom, he taught with a lot of enthusiasm and kept interest level high with clear explanations about the principles of the earth sciences. Many students pursued teaching as a profession due in large part to the influence of Norm Wisner. In the early years of THS, Norm was an Assistant Football Coach to Coach Chuck Loete and an Assistant Basketball Coach to Coach Bill Ward. In football, Norm coached the linemen who after two tough seasons, developed into a league championship line. His linemen always practiced fast and hard and toward the end of their game week preparation, Norm added a little fun to the practice regimen. The linemen played "knee ball"; a game where the linemen were running backs, QB, and receivers. They played football on their knees; what a fun way to end a week of practice for linemen who don't get many opportunities to touch the ball during games. In basketball, Norm coached the JV as well as work with varsity on individual skills. Most memorable was Norm's explanation of "best shooting trajectory". He would explain that the basketball hoop lays in a horizontal plane and shots have a better chance going through if shots were executed at a higher trajectory. He was also willing to stay after practice to shag balls for the player to develop their shot and also to prove his point about "best shooting trajectory". Also memorable was his suggestions on "best playing posture" which later became known as the "triple threat position." Norm was also a very positive motivator to all athletes, always encouraging that they "can do" it if they put their mind to it.

The high school years are such a critical period in a person's life. It is the early transition from adolescence to adult-hood. Work habits are developed, lifetime goals are contemplated and created, and career tracks are initiated. The staff at THS did a great job of facilitating this transition period and Norm Wisner had a very significant role in creating positive attitudes among the students of THS and encouraging them to excel at what ever they chose to do. Through his many years of dedicated service, it was no surprise that Norm Wisner eventually became the Superintendent of the Tumwater School District. On behalf of so many former students at THS, thank you Mr. Wisner for your enthusiastic approach to teaching, coaching, and leading the district.

Devin Reich




Two THSAA members have been selected for the positions: The Golf Coordinator is Kevin Campbell and the Historian is Judi Hambrick.

NFL HIGH SCHOOL COACH OF THE YEAR AWARD

The NFL announced today the high school football coaches nominated by the 32 NFL teams for the Don Shula NFL High School Coach of the Year Award. Representing the best at the high school level, these coaches were nominated for the national award, named for the winningest coach in NFL history, by NFL teams for their character and integrity, leadership and dedication to the community, commitment to player health and safety, and on-field success.

"High school football coaches have a profound impact on the lives of young athletes. We are honored to recognize these individuals who embody the leadership and commitment to excellence demonstrated by Coach Shula," said NFL Commissioner ROGER GOODELL. "Their dedication to developing young men of character will lead their players to success far beyond the field of play."

For the first time, Don Shula Award nominees from all 32 teams will be invited and recognized in special ways during the NFL's week-long celebration of football at the 2017 Pro Bowl in Orlando. The coaches will visit Pro Bowl practices, participate in the USA Football National Conference and attend the Pro Bowl at Camping World Stadium. The coaches will be made available to media on **Saturday, Jan. 28** at **2 PM ET** at the Orange County Convention Center in Orlando.


Two finalists will each receive \$15,000 from the NFL Foundation, \$10,000 of which will go to his high school's football program. The Shula Award winner will be announced during the third quarter of the **2017 Pro Bowl**, airing **Sunday**, **Jan. 29** at **8 PM ET** on ESPN, and will receive an additional \$10,000 from the NFL Foundation, \$5,000 of which will go to his high school's football program. The winner will be recognized at a press conference on Friday, Feb. 3 during Super Bowl week in Houston and walk the red carpet at NFL Honors, a two-hour primetime awards special airing nationally on FOX on Feb. 4, the night before Super Bowl LI.

The winner is selected by a panel of distinguished individuals. New to the Don Shula NFL High School Coach of the Year Award selection panel this year are two-time Super Bowl champion (XLI, 50) and five-time NFL MVP **PEYTON MANNING**, Super Bowl XLII champion and Good Morning America contributor **MICHAEL STRAHAN** and Pro Football Hall of Fame President **DAVID BAKER**.
